Body, Soul, and Spirit

Different views of mankind:

Greek Mind-body dualism vs. Judeo-Christian tripartite view Nature of human affliction, biopsychosocial model

- Soma: body, physical, biological
- Psyche: interpersonal, emotional, psychological
- Social: interpersonal, family systems, group influences
- all considered to be objectively verifiable
- open to scientific study, knowledge
- therefore part of medicine

Spiritual considered to be realm of religious belief

- Pneumo: breath or wind
- not visible, a matter of personal opinion
- not open to scientific study or knowledge?
- therefore usually left to religious authorities

However, human beings are integrated whole beings

• Spiritual issues are often at center of illness, recovery
