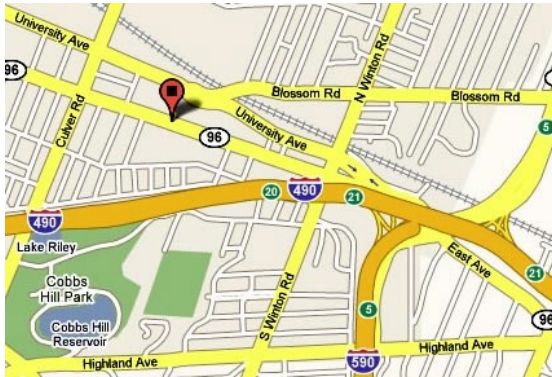

Academy Directions

Map to the Academy of Medicine



1441 East Avenue

From 490 eastbound: Exit at Winton Road, turn left on to Winton Road, proceed north across the overpass and turn left on to East Avenue. The Academy is about 0.5 miles, on the left.

From 490 westbound: Exit at University Avenue, turn left on to Winton Road, proceed south and turn right on to East Avenue. The Academy is about 0.5 miles, on the left.

From 590 northbound: Exit at Highland Avenue, proceed across Highland Avenue, past Midtown Athletic Club. Turn left on to East Avenue. The Academy is about 1.0 mile, on the left.

From 590 southbound: Exit at Blossom Road, turn right on to Blossom Rd and proceed west to Winton Road. Turn left on to Winton Road and proceed south for 0.3 miles and turn right on to East Avenue. The Academy is about 0.5 miles, on the left.

About

MCCF is a group of Christians in the health professions, primarily medical students, associated with the Medical Center at the University of Rochester who gather regularly for fellowship, prayer, study, and investigation of ethical issues. The group has been an active part of the Medical Center community for over 25 years and encourages students in their personal faith as well as helping them identify and participate in community service projects and missions experiences abroad.

Vision

The vision of MCCF is to encourage students in the medical profession and associated disciplines to grow closer in their relationship with God and His Son, Jesus Christ, amidst the demanding pressures of rigorous schedules and intensity of work, by gathering regularly in fellowship and promoting commitment to a local church throughout the years of school. Through Bible study, overseas missions, and testimonies, we seek to equip our members to share their faith with unbelievers and inspire them with a desire to serve others, both the needy of our community and our fellow classmates, with generosity. We also seek to foster cogent Christian thinking in our discussion of ethics, medicine, and other intellectual issues, and openly deny secular humanism, preferring instead a

worldview led by the Holy Spirit and filled with godly compassion.

Activities

MCCF meets regularly through the school year for fellowship, Bible study, prayer, and other special events, service projects, and short-term missions trips.

Regular Meetings

Each fall the group's incoming leadership decides what format its regular meetings will take. Often there will be a weekly time of Bible study and prayer, hosted at the home of someone in the group.

Several times a year dinner meetings are arranged, usually in the home of a community faculty member. Service project opportunities arise throughout the year and are publicized by email and on our website.

MD Breakfasts

Three times a year, usually in October, January, and May, MCCF sponsors a Christian Physician Breakfast hosted at the Rochester Academy of Medicine (see directions on back). Students, faculty, and community providers invite a guest speaker and share an enriching time of fellowship. Past speakers have included Bruce Jackson from CCHF, Dr. David Stevens from CMDA, Dr. Dan Fountain, Dr. John Patrick, and many others. Each winter the focus is usually on missions with several presenters and options for short-term service.
